## What Is Title I?

Title I is a federally funded program that provides assistance to schools so that children can meet state academic performance standards. The Title I program at Rossford Elementary focuses on Reading and Mathematics Achievement. We are a Schoolwide Program, which means that all students in the building benefit from the funding.

At Rossford Elementary, Mrs. Terri Retzloff and Ms. Julie Thoman are the Reading Specialists. Students are selected for intervention based on teacher recommendation, the Ohio State Tests, the Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills (DIBELS) for grades K-3, and the STAR Reading/Math assessment for grades 3-5. Students may also receive assistance from Academic Intervention Teachers (AITs), intervention specialists, as well as classroom teachers.

Our intervention programs are related to the core instructional programs in regular classrooms and are based on the Ohio English Language Arts and Mathematics Learning standards. Reading instruction is aligned with the American Reading Company, Fundations, and Heggerty curricula, and Math instruction utilizes the Into Math curriculum. Instruction can be given in the regular classroom, in a small group pull-out setting, or in a combination of both.

In addition to providing instructional materials, Title I funding is used to promote parental involvement.
