#### 2025 Spring Ohio's State Tests

Students at Rossford Junior-Senior High School (6th-12th) will take the graduation required Ohio's State Tests (OST) on the dates and times listed below. Students are encouraged to take these tests seriously as the tests are one measure that tell us how well our students are growing in the knowledge and skills outlined in Ohio's Learning Standards. These tests help guide and strengthen future teaching so we can be sure that we are preparing our students for long-term success in school, college, careers, and life.

#### Chromebooks

ALL students are expected to bring their school issued chromebook each day they are scheduled to take an OST. Chromebooks **need to** be charged overnight and in working condition for each scheduled test.

#### **Sleep and Nutrition**

Students are encouraged to be well rested. This will allow students to be more alert, focused, and ready for each test. Students should also try and eat breakfast to help fuel their brain and stay energized while working through each test.

#### Schedule

During English Language Arts (ELA), Mathematical, Science and Social Studies Ohio Testing Dates, <u>HIGH</u> <u>SCHOOL</u> students who are <u>NOT</u> scheduled to test have two options:

- Students may choose to come in late (9:45 am) and follow the 2-Hour delay schedule provided they have their own transportation. District transportation will operate on the normal schedule.
- Students may choose to come in at the regular scheduled time (7:45am) and report to a supervised study hall. Once testing is complete in the building, students will follow the 2-Hour delay schedule. District transportation will operate on the normal schedule.

ALL students grades 6-8 students will attend ALL school days during testing.

#### **Testing Dates/Times:**

- April 8 & April 9, 2025 English Language Arts Parts 1 and 2 (ELA 6, 7, 8 and ELA II (HS))
   7:45am 9:45am ALL students who are scheduled to test are expected to report by 7:45am.
- April 15 April 16, 2025 US History and American Government Parts 1 and 2 (HS)
   *ALL JH students report to school / High School Students see schedule above*
- April 23 April 24, 2025 Science Parts 1 and 2 (Biology and Science 8)
   ALL JH students report to school / High School Students see schedule above
- April 29 May 1, 2025 Math Parts 1 and 2 (Math 6, 7, 8, Integrated Mathematics I & II, Algebra I, or Geometry)
  - 7:45am 9:45am ALL students who are scheduled to test are expected to report by 7:45am

Rooms for testing: Students will be notified of their room and teacher assignment for each test they are taking

# Attendance

With SafeArrival/SchoolMessenger, you are asked to report your child's absence in advance using any of the 3 convenient methods listed below. Parents/guardians will be contacted by phone and email via SafeArrival if student absences have not been reported by 8:45.

 Using your mobile device: download and install the SchoolMessenger app from the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store. The icon for the app looks like the below image. The first time you use the app, select Sign Up to create your account. Select Attendance -> Report an Absence

- PowerSchool Parent Portal: Use the SafeArrival website via the SchoolMessenger link in PowerSchool Parent Portal online. Log into the PowerSchool Parent portal then scroll down and click on the SchoolMessenger link on the left.
- 3. **Toll-free number**: Call the toll-free number **1-844-867-6066** to report an absence using the automated phone system.


# ABOUT THE PARENT PROJECT


Parents participate and learn in a classroom model to manage teen behavior problems at home.
