What Is Title I?

Title I is a federally funded program that provides assistance to schools so that children can meet state academic performance standards. The Title I program at Rossford Jr/Sr High focuses on Reading and Mathematics Achievement. We are a Schoolwide Program, which means that all students in the building benefit from the funding.

At Rossford Jr/Sr High, Mr. Rob Lillie is the Academic Intervention Teacher. Students are selected for intervention based on teacher recommendation, the Ohio State Tests and the STAR Reading/Math assessments. Students may also receive assistance from intervention specialists, as well as classroom teachers.

Our intervention programs are related to the core instructional programs in regular classrooms and are based on the Ohio English Language Arts and Mathematics Learning standards. Reading instruction is aligned with the Amplify ELA program and Math instruction utilizes the Reveal Math Curriculum by McGraw Hill. Instruction can be given in the regular classroom, in a small group setting, or in a combination of both.

In addition to providing instructional materials, Title I funding is used to promote parental involvement.
