

A completely online curriculum option for 2020-2021



Rossford Virtual Academy (RVA)

- The Rossford Virtual Academy (RVA) is a completely online option for the 2020-2021 school year.
- Curriculum for RVA is provided through NOVA (Northwest Ohio Virtual Academy).
- Students who participate in RVA are still enrolled as a Rossford Student. While RVA students will not attend classes on the physical campus, they are still welcome to participate in athletics and other district-sponsored activities as scheduling permits.
- RVA is available to all students K-12. All courses are self-paced and completely student-driven. It is highly recommended that younger students (kindergarten through 3rd grade) have an adult at home to serve as their learning partner and to help them navigate through the course.

Navigating through NOVA

- NOVA provides the curriculum for RVA through a user-friendly Learning Management System (LMS) called Buzz. Buzz is similar to other LMS such as Google Classroom.
- Students are assigned to courses by Rossford Staff.
 - There are different curriculum options within NOVA, such as Bright Thinker, eDynamics, and Lincoln Learning. The curriculum options assigned to students will be dependent upon the course and grade level.
 - Course assignments will be consistent with what is offered on-campus (see more details on the following slides).
- A teacher will be assigned to monitor completion and grade assignments when necessary. This teacher will also serve as a point of contact for students and parents if they are having difficulty navigating through the course or encounter any technical issues.
- It is important that families know that these courses will be self-driven. It will be the responsibility of the student, with the support of their parent, to continue working through the lessons and curriculum. Parents will be responsible for keeping track of their child's progress and ensuring that students are completing the lessons. Students opting in the Rossford Virtual Academy through NOVA will need to be self-starters who can work through the curriculum with their parents.

VIDEO: An Overview of NOVA

- This 34-minute video below explains the difference between two of the online learning curricula that NOVA uses. One is Lincoln Learning (K-12) and the other is Bright Thinker (grades 3-12). This informational video first explains the differences, then goes into what it looks like. Including...
 - How to log in at 3 minutes and 45 seconds into the piece
 - What courses look like for students at beginning at 4 minutes and 30 seconds
 - What the parent's access looks like to check on work being turned in, grades, credits etc. from 5 minutes to 8 minutes.
 - At 15:40 seconds we see what English Language Arts 2 class looks like and the beginning of a lesson.
 - The rest of the video shows different lessons, curriculum and even a lab assignment.

HOW DO I SIGN MY CHILD UP FOR ROSSFORD VIRTUAL ACADEMY (RVA)?

You have until Friday, August 7 to opt your child into the Rossford Virtual Academy through NOVA. You can opt in through this link:

IF WE SELECT RVA, WILL A TEACHER BE AVAILABLE TO HELP MY CHILD?

A teacher will be assigned to monitor completion and grade assignments if required. The teacher will serve as the parent and student's primary contact if they have technical issues navigating through the course. The teacher does not provide instruction or assistance with the actual content.

WILL THE SCHOOL PROVIDE A DEVICE FOR RVA?

Yes. Rossford Schools will provide Chromebooks to all students who opt-in to RVA for the 2020-2021 school year.

WHEN WILL MY CHILD GET THEIR CHROMEBOOK?

Rossford Schools is providing devices for students in our Rossford Virtual Academy. Pick up is August 19 from 8:30 a.m. to 6 p.m. If your child is in K-5, pickup is at Rossford Elementary School, if your child is in grades 6-12 pickup will be at the junior-senior high school.

DOES MY CHILD HAVE TO SIGN ON AT A CERTAIN TIME OF THE DAY?

The content is self-paced and can be completed whenever it is most convenient for your family. Students are not required to be logged on for a certain amount of time on any given day. Content is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

WHAT IF WE CHANGE OUR MINDS?

RVA is a yearlong commitment, with the option to flip to the on-campus option between the first and second semesters (first semester ends Jan. 14, second semester begins on Jan. 19). Students are not able to change at any other point during the year.

WHAT IF THE ON-CAMPUS SITUATION CHANGES?

If the learning environment shifts from hybrid to remote, or from hybrid to five days on campus, students who opt-in to RVA will remain in RVA. Students are not permitted to switch, except for at the semester break.

WILL MY CHILD BE PREPARED IF WE SWITCH BACK TO ON-CAMPUS AT THE SEMESTER BREAK IF WE CHOOSE TO DO SO?

One of the benefits of the NOVA curriculum is that the sequence of instruction can be adjusted in many courses to align with the order that things are taught in school. The ability to adjust the sequence of the instruction will be beneficial for students who choose to flip from RVA to on-campus at the semester break. While the on-campus and RVA curriculums are different, the content is largely the same.

MY CHILD HAS A DISABILITY AND HAS AN IEP. CAN HE/SHE STILL CHOOSE NOVA?

Absolutely. Following the opt-in deadline, parents of students with disabilities will be contacted to discuss necessary adjustments to their child's educational program and related special education services. WE SIGNED UP FOR RVA, WHY DID WE GET A COHORT ASSIGNMENT?

All students were assigned a cohort for hybrid learning. The deadline to select RVA is not until August 7th at which time PowerSchool will be updated to reflect RVA, rather than a cohort assignment. If you received an email with a cohort assignment, please disregard.

IF WE SIGN UP FOR RVA, DO I NEED TO PURCHASE SCHOOL SUPPLIES?

You will not need to send any supplies into school or pay the \$35 school supply fee. All of the content within RVA can be completed digitally, but you may want to have basic supplies such as crayons and pencils on hand depending on your child's age and grade.

WILL MY CHILD INTERACT WITH OTHER STUDENTS THROUGH RVA?

No, students will not interact with other students when completing the online instructional program. RVA students are able to participate in district-sponsored extra-curricular activities and athletics.

WE SIGNED UP FOR RVA ONLINE... WHAT'S NEXT?

On August 10th parents who opted-in to NOVA will receive a confirmation email. Device pickup will be held on August 19th and RVA will be up and running on August 20th for students to begin their courses.
